

Accomodations

Youth campers are housed in bay style dorms. Junior campers must stay with a family member or sponsoring adult.

Adults and children are housed in the "Old Hotel" or in family cabins which are available on a first come first serve basis.

What To Bring

Bedding, towels, and hygienic items are needed in addition to clothing for the week. Youth will need old clothes for some of their activities, and everyone will need dress clothes for the Friday night banquet. Bring some money for the snack bar on the grounds and for offerings. Directions

Cherry Run Camp is located a short distance Northwest of the village of Rimersburg, PA.

- From I-80: Take route 68 South to Sligo, turn left at the caution light and continue on Route 68. Watch for camp direction sign on right, and make a right turn on to road leading to camp.
- From New Bethlehem: Take Route 861 to Rimersburg; turn left at the stop sign, go two blocks; turn right at the stop light; three miles to camp
- From Callensburg: Watch for sign in the dip just outside of Callensburg as you go Southwest on route 368. Turn left at the sign.
